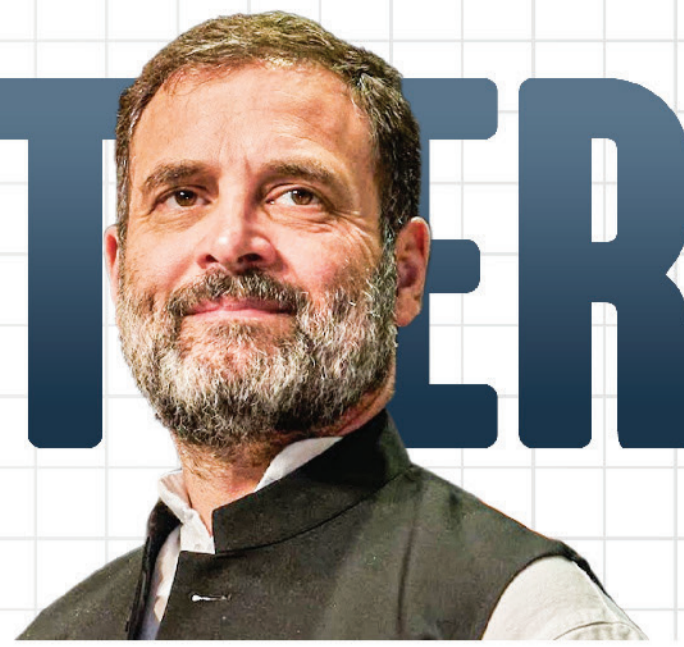

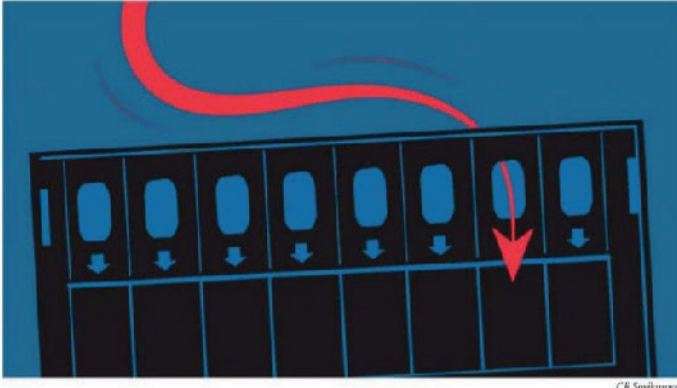
Match-fixing Maharashtra

IN MY PLEDGE TO SPEECH on February 3, and in a subsequent press conference, I had expressed my disquiet about the conduct of the November 2024 Maharashtra Vidhan Sabha elections. I have doubted the fairness of Indian elections, not every place, not everywhere, but often enough, I am not talking of small-scale cheating but of institutional rigging breaching the fabric of our national institutions. But if some earlier election outcomes seemed odd, the outcome of the 2024 Maharashtra Vidhan Sabha elections is glaringly strange. The scale of rigging was so desperate that, despite all efforts to conceal it, irrefutable evidence has emerged from official statistics, without reliance on any nonofficial source, revealing a step-by-step playbook.



Flagging Match-Fixing in Maharashtra

Through a widely read article, Rahul Gandhi revealed how lakhs of fake voters quietly entered Maharashtra's electoral rolls ahead of the Vidhan Sabha elections.



Taking the Fight to Parliament

Speaking in Parliament, Rahul Gandhi warned that vote theft strikes at the heart of the nation, detailing how the BJP weakened the Election Commission by removing the Chief Justice from its selection panel, granting immunity, and mandating deletion of CCTV footage after 45 days.



Resisting the Capture of Institutions

As Leader of the Opposition, Rahul Gandhi formally recorded dissent against partisan appointments to key constitutional posts, including the Chief Election Commissioner, Chief Vigilance Commissioner, and Information Commissioners.



Warning Against the Erosion of RTI

Rahul Gandhi engaged with activists, editors, and researchers who raised alarms about the Digital Personal Data Protection Act and its potential to weaken the Right to Information Act.



FIGHTING FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE



Sustaining the Fight for a Caste Census

After years of sustained pressure by the Congress and Bahujan activists, Rahul Gandhi welcomed the BJP government's reluctant concession to conduct a caste census.



Setting the Benchmark for The Caste Census

Rahul Gandhi commended the Telangana Government for successfully conducting the Caste Census, setting a milestone for Social Justice, and serving as an example for the national Caste Census. He reiterated the need to remove the 50% cap on reservation, and supported Telangana's efforts to do so.



Strengthening SC and ST Sub Plans

Rahul Gandhi engaged with Dalit and Adivasi activists and researchers to address the underutilisation of funds meant for Scheduled Caste and Tribal welfare, stressing the need for stronger central legislation for equitable access to resources.



Recognising the Backbone of India

Rahul Gandhi met Anganwadi workers who spoke about the lack of dignity, fair wages, and recognition for their indispensable contribution.



Demanding Fair OBC Representation

In Parliament, Rahul Gandhi met representatives of the National Confederation of OBC Employees Welfare, who highlighted the persistent underrepresentation of OBCs in government jobs.



Confronting Exclusion by Design

Rahul Gandhi held conversations with Dalit influencers to unpack the structural barriers that continue to exclude Dalits from education and corporate leadership.



REIMAGINING A SUCCESSFUL ECONOMY



Redefining Growth Through Jobs

Speaking in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi argued that true economic success must be measured by job creation. He criticised Make in India for failing to create jobs and increase manufacturing. He emphasised that India must lead in emerging sectors like electric motors, optics in drones, batteries, and artificial intelligence.



Recognising Indian Talent

At Nehru Place, Rahul Gandhi highlighted that India assembles products rather than truly manufacturing them. He underscored that India can only become a manufacturing powerhouse only by empowering small producers with access to financial and manufacturing support.



Highlighting India's Manufacturing Challenges

During a visit to a TV manufacturing unit, Rahul Gandhi cautioned that without building real manufacturing capacity, India cannot hope to compete with China.



Challenging Crony Capitalism

Rahul Gandhi drew attention to the Bhagalpur land deal in Bihar, where the government snatched farmers' land and sold it to Adani for ₹1. He also criticised GST policies that have placed undue pressure on farmers, workers, and small traders.



Listening to Bihar's Fisherfolk

Joining fishermen in the water, Rahul Gandhi amplified their demands for safety, fair prices, and dignity for fishing communities.



Asking Who Really Profits from Makhana

Meeting makhana farmers in Bihar, Rahul Gandhi highlighted the deep injustice that sees Bihar produce 90% of the world's makhana while farmers earn less than 1% of the profits.

BUILDING THE FUTURE

Choosing Leadership with Courage not Optics

Addressing the Pahalgam terrorist attack and Operation Sindoor in Parliament, Rahul Gandhi warned that serious foreign policy failures have left India isolated, even as Pakistan and China operate as a unified front.



Questioning Handshakes Over Homeland

Rahul Gandhi criticised the Modi government for celebrating diplomatic engagements with China while it continues to occupy Indian territory.



Declaring Air Pollution a National Emergency

Rahul Gandhi described toxic air as a public health crisis, urging Parliament to adopt a clear, city-wise plan to make India's air breathable again.



Preparing Youth for a Changing World

Rahul Gandhi engaged with young people from Nagaland, underscoring that India's future depends on adaptability, technology, and education rooted in diversity.



Linking English Education to Employment

Interacting with Dalit youth in Raebareli, Rahul Gandhi stressed that English education is key to wider job opportunities. He criticized the BJP for denying poor Bahujan students English education while their children study abroad.



Walking to Listen to Dalit Youth

Stopped by Bihar police en route to the Ambedkar Welfare Hostel in Darbhanga, Rahul Gandhi walked over 2.5 kilometres to meet students and emphasise dialogue, education justice, and inclusion.



REPRESENTING THE PEOPLE'S VOICE



Pushing Back Against the Destruction of MGNREGA

In a Press Conference, Rahul Gandhi accused PM Modi of single-handedly destroying MGNREGA, the world's largest rural employment guarantee scheme. He highlighted how MGNREGA was a rights based concept that allowed millions of people to be lifted out of poverty and was a safety net in villages.



Standing with the People of Poonch

After indiscriminate Pakistani firing killed 13 civilians in Poonch, Rahul Gandhi met affected families and urged the Prime Minister to announce a concrete rehabilitation package.



Remembering Zubeen Da

In Sonpur, Assam, Rahul Gandhi paid tribute to Zubeen Garg ji and met his family. He called for a fair and transparent investigation.



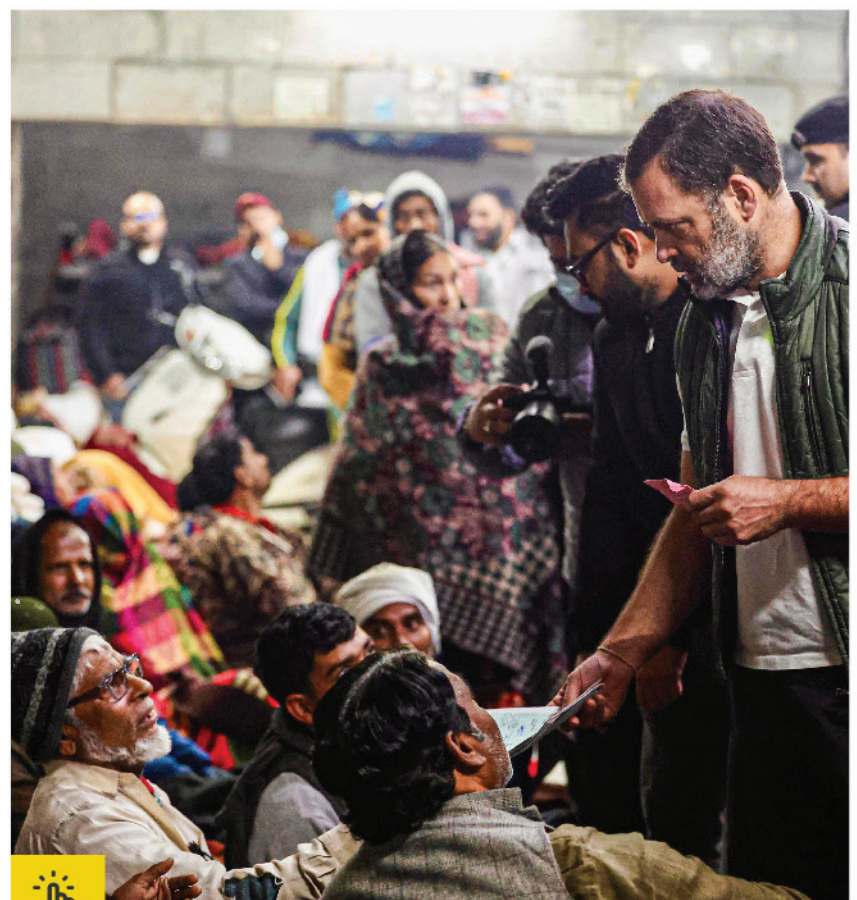
Supporting Those Who Serve

Raising Punjab's Flood Crisis in Parliament
